In the event of a large-scale disaster (earthquake, wild-fire, flood, etc.), individuals, CERT Teams, communities and other groups in and around Oakland may need to depend on information and assistance from others. However cell, Internet and landline phone communications may be overloaded or disrupted for some time.

During and after such an emergency, the GENOAK 2-way radio network can provide an alternate means for voice communications to connect with others and report on threats and incidents, provide status updates, share resources, mobilize volunteers and coordinate needed assistance, among other tasks.

In addition, critical messages may be able to be relayed to authorities. And important information from the City and other emergency response professionals may be communicated back to GENOAK radio operators.
