In the event of a large-scale disaster such as a wildfire, earthquake or flood, individuals, communities, CERT Teams, hubs and other groups in and around Oakland may need information and assistance from others. However, cellular/landline phone and Internet communications may be overloaded or disrupted for some time.

During and after an emergency, the GENOAK 2-way radio network can provide an alternate means for voice communications to report on threats and incidents, provide health and welfare updates, share resources, mobilize volunteers and coordinate needed assistance, among other tasks.

In addition, critical messages may be able to be relayed to authorities. And important information from the City and other emergency response professionals may be communicated back to GENOAK radio operators.
